



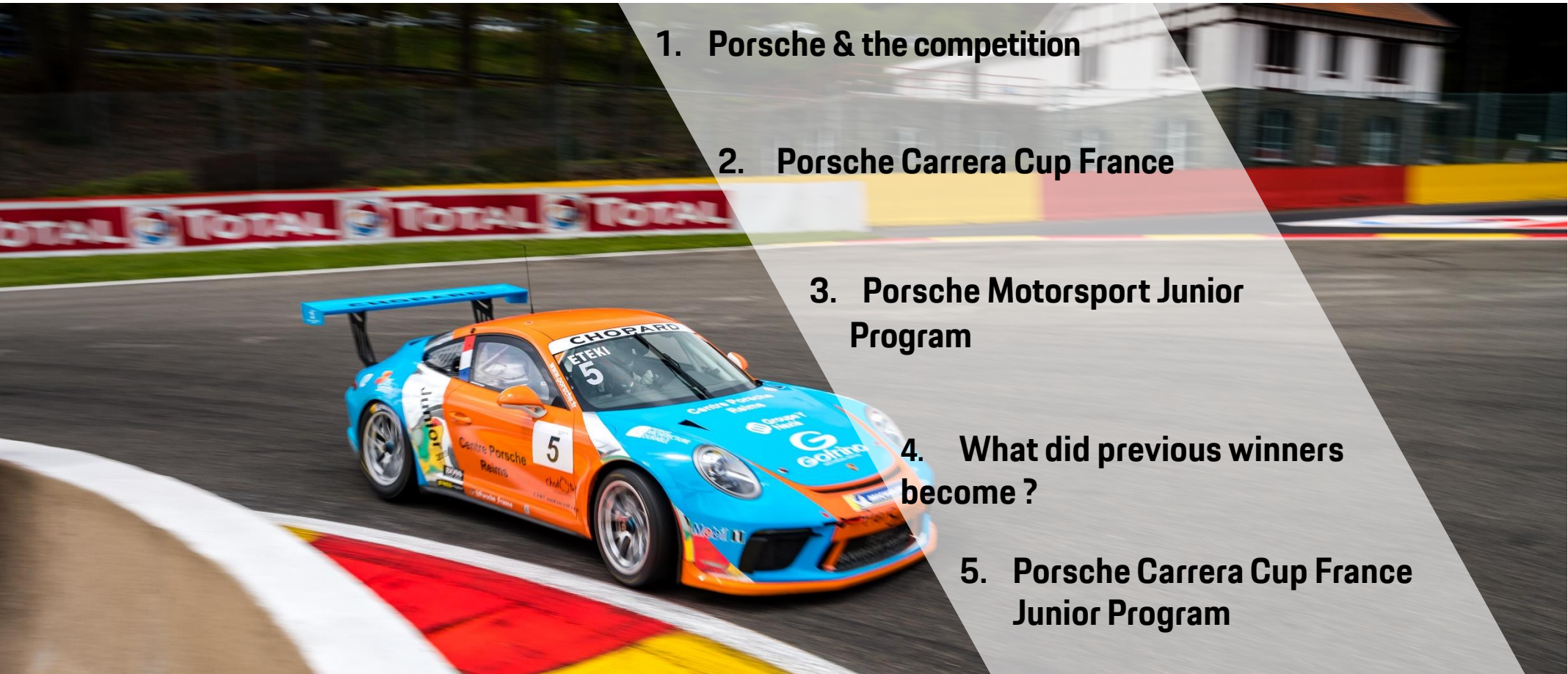

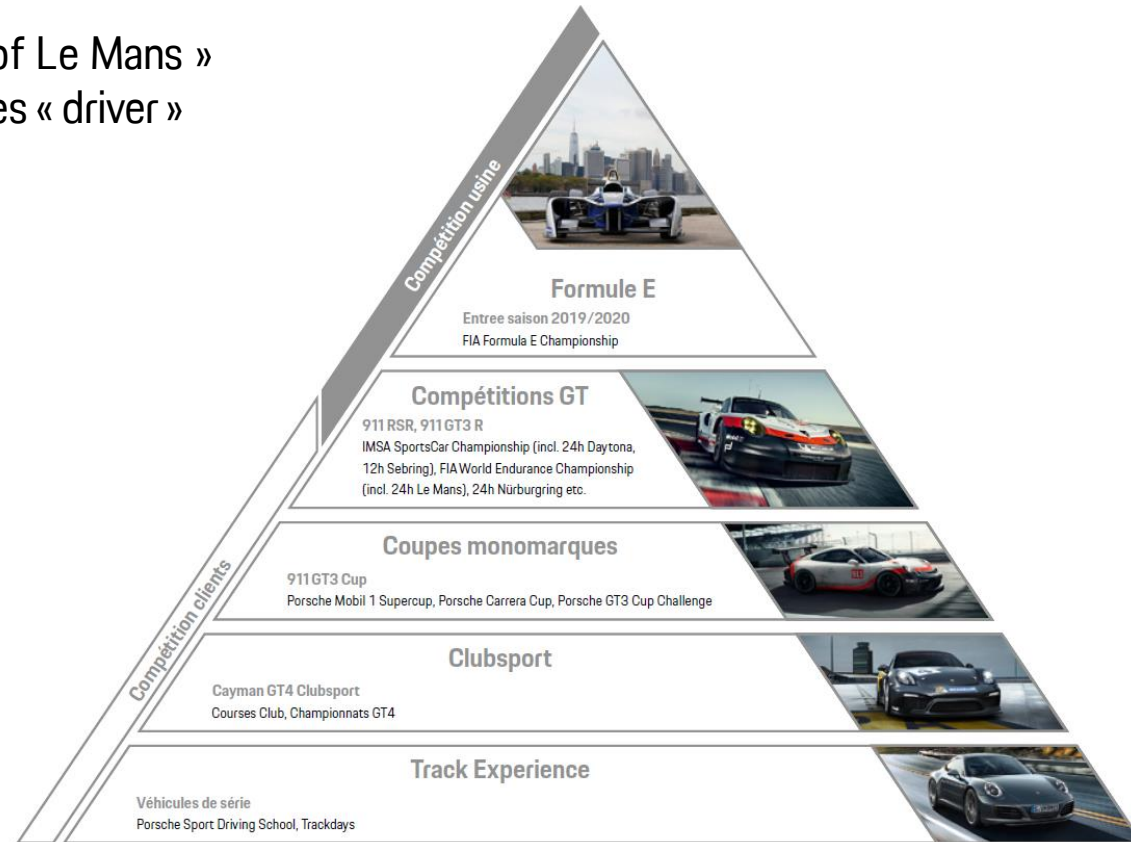

- ✓ 2 victories at the Paris-Dakar Rally

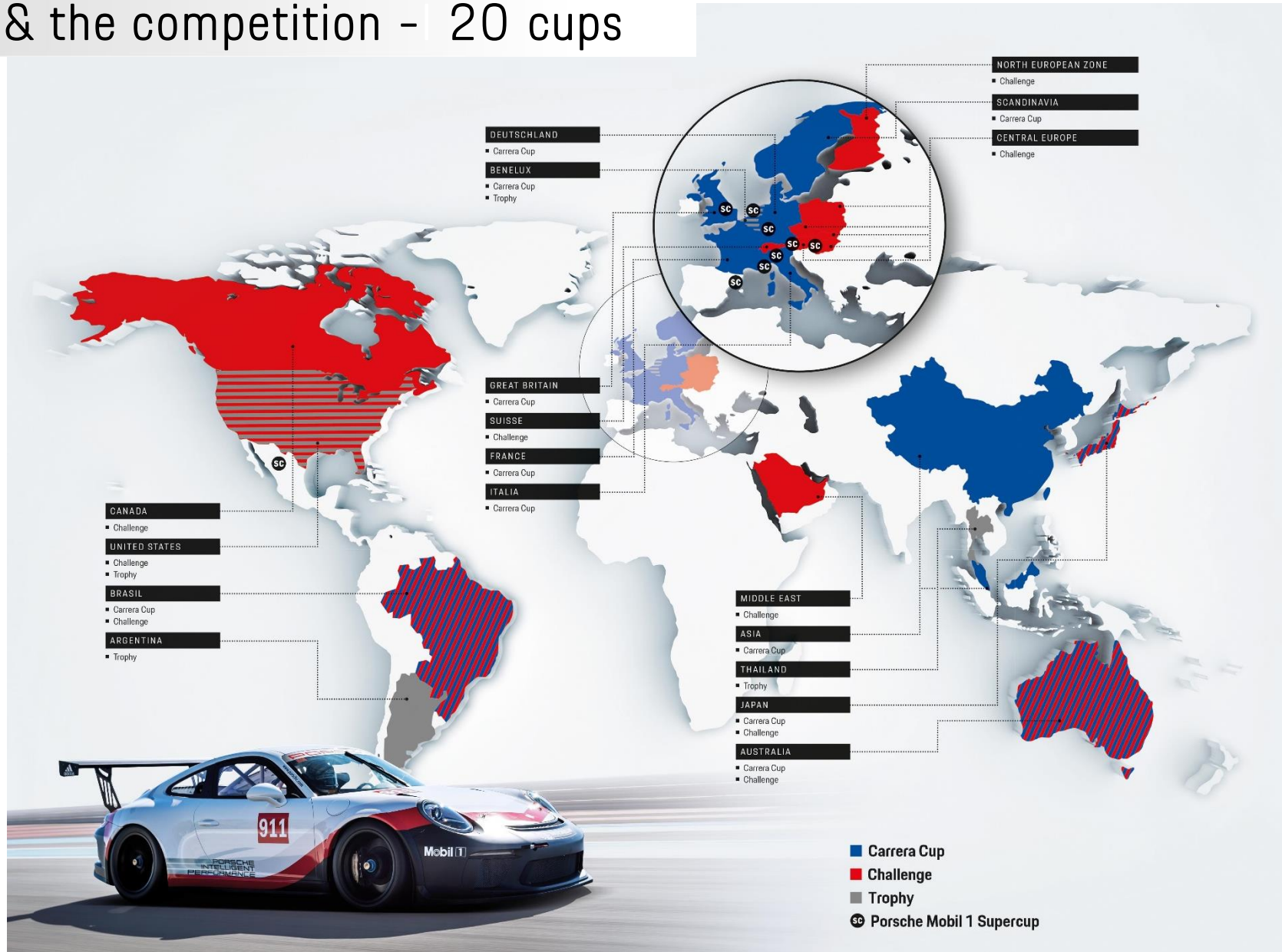
With an experience of more than **30,000 victories** in competition, Porsche is the most important brand in motorsport. More than a passion, it's a principle.

From **production car** to the **Formula E**, the road to become a professional driver is already traced.



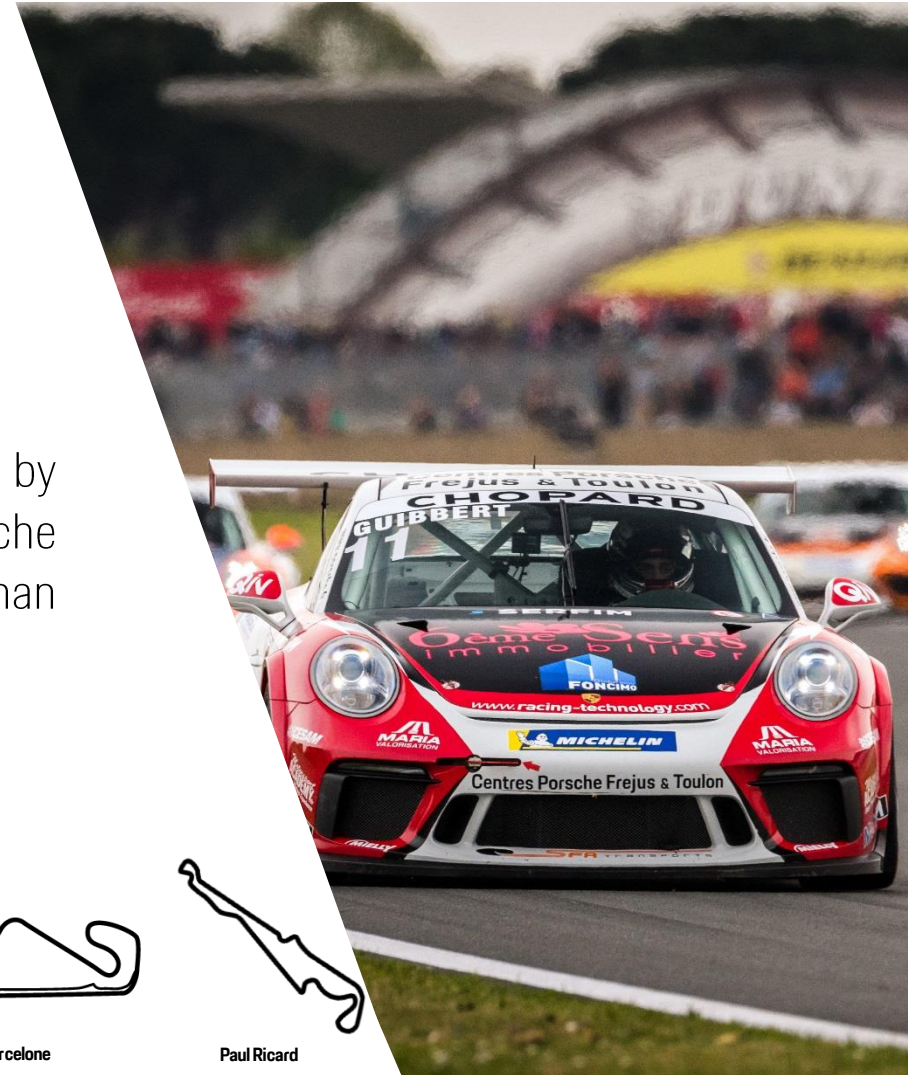

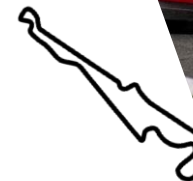

# Porsche Motorsport Junior Program

- At Porsche, we identify the drivers at the national level through the Porsche Carrera Cup France Junior Program and we bring them to the highest level through the **Porsche Motorsport Junior Program**.
- Each year, we select a driver to represent the Porsche Carrera Cup France in this international Program.

As **Mathieu Jaminet** in 2015 or **Julien Andlauer** in 2017, the selected driver will defend the French colors among 8 drivers of Porsche Carrera Cup from around the world pursuing a purse of 200,000€ to participate in the **Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup** the following season.





# Porsche Carrera Cup France Winners | What did previous winners become ?

In 10 years, the Porsche Carrera Cup France invited nine of its winners to become professional drivers, including five at Porsche.

- Official Porsche driver since 2015

- Winner of the Motorsport Junior Program in 2015
- Official Porsche Junior Driver since 2016



## Julien Andlauer

- Winner of the Porsche Carrera Cup France in 2017
- Official Porsche Junior Driver since 2018

## Porsche Carrera Cup France Junior Program | Criteria to apply

- Born between 30.11.1994 and 01.03.2004.
- Has never raced in Porsche Carrera Cup or in Porsche GT3 Cup Challenge.
- Has a real experience in high level karting or motorsports.
- Be eligible for an International License C.
- **Expectations:**
  - Adopt an attitude in line with Porsche Motorsport values.
  - Possess fluent and proficient language skills in English.
  - Have a business plan to secure the supplementary budget for the season.
  - Have never been the subject of any disciplinary sanctions (sports).
  - Have never received a precious scholarship in a Porsche Motorsport Program.
- **Registration:** 2,600€ ex VAT (discount of 10% for all registrations before September 27<sup>th</sup>)
  - Includes accommodations, food and all on-site tests
