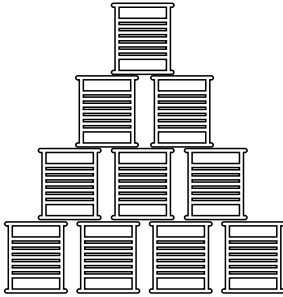


Steering wheel design

- › Print this wheel out
- › Customise the outer wheel as desired with pens, paints or pencils
- › Stick the design to a paper plate using pritt stick
- › Cut out safely with scissors if needed
- › TOP TIP: Tape a loo roll to the back of your steering wheel and then attach to your cardboard box to enhance your driving experience!

Tin Can Alley

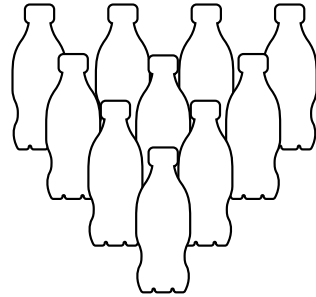
You will need:

- > 10 empty food tins
- > 3 tennis balls or throwing bean bags
- > Notepad & pen to record the score

1. Decorate your tins & number them
2. Stack the tins
3. Set throwing position
4. Throw the 3 balls at the cans trying to knock as many down as possible.
5. Make a record of the total score of all 3 throws - 1 point for each can.

FUN TIP:

Fill the empty tins with water for some extra fun and get everyone wet.



Skittles

You will need:

- > 10 clear empty plastic bottles
- > Rice or sand for added weight
- > 3 balls

1. Arrange the bottles into a triangular shape
2. Set throwing position
3. Knock over as many as possible

FUN TIP:

Why not add a few drops of food colouring to each bottle and get extra points for certain colours.

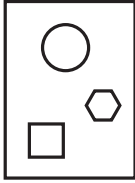
1948 is the year Porsche was founded.

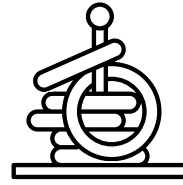


Bean Bag Toss Game

You will need:

- › 1 large piece of cardboard
- › Scissors
- › Item to prop up the board – why not used some stacked books?
- › Ribbon
- › Bean bags or balls

1. Cut your holes into the cardboard – create different sizes and positions on the board to test your skills
2. Prop up your board so it is raised off the ground at an angle – either with some books or up against a wall
3. Create your pitcher space by setting out some ribbon on the floor
4. Create a timed competition to see how many you can get in 30 seconds, or set a number you have to reach and the first person to make that score wins. If the player crosses the ribbon, they are out!



Paper Plate Toss Game

You will need:

- › Paper plates
- › Paint and paint brush (optional)
- › Kitchen paper tube
- › Tape
- › Scissors

1. Make your ring toss base by painting the kitchen paper tube and the top of one paper plate in your favourite colours.
2. Once dry, cut 4 to 6 slits that are a half-inch long on the bottom of the kitchen paper tube. Tape the slits onto the paper plate and your stand is complete
3. To make the tossing rings, paint them in your favourite colours and once dry, cut out the middle to make your rings. Make as many as you want!
4. Let the fun begin!

6 is the number of Porsche models there are.

The first person to get 6 bean bags through the holes in a row gets an extra 5 points!

80 is the number of Porsche models on display in the Porsche museum in Germany.

Make your own homemade Hill Climb

You will need:

- › Your Porsche toy cars
- › Hill Climb / ramp material (cardboard, wood, wooden posts, swimming noodle, anything you can repurpose)
- › 3 various sized cardboard boxes for the winners podium
- › Stopwatch
- › Scissors
- › Tape
- › Start and Finish signs
- › Paint if desired
- › A winning prize

FUN TIP: Cut a swimming pool noodle in half lengthways then stick multiple together to create individual lanes.

ADDITIONAL CHALLENGE:
The official Goodwood Hill Climb is 1.16 miles. How long can you make yours?



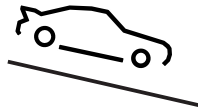
Step 1: Assemble

- › Decide on your track material, how many lanes you want and how long to make it.
- › Paint and number your 3 podium boxes.
- › Make your start and finish signs.



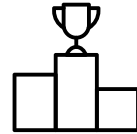
Step 2: Get into position

- › Decide where your track will be placed - from a sofa, a table, a tree.
- › Decide on any forfeits for falling off the track.



Step 3: Race

- › Decide on how many times you want to race to determine the winners
- › Line your cars at the top of the hill, ready to descend.
- › Start the stopwatch and Race!

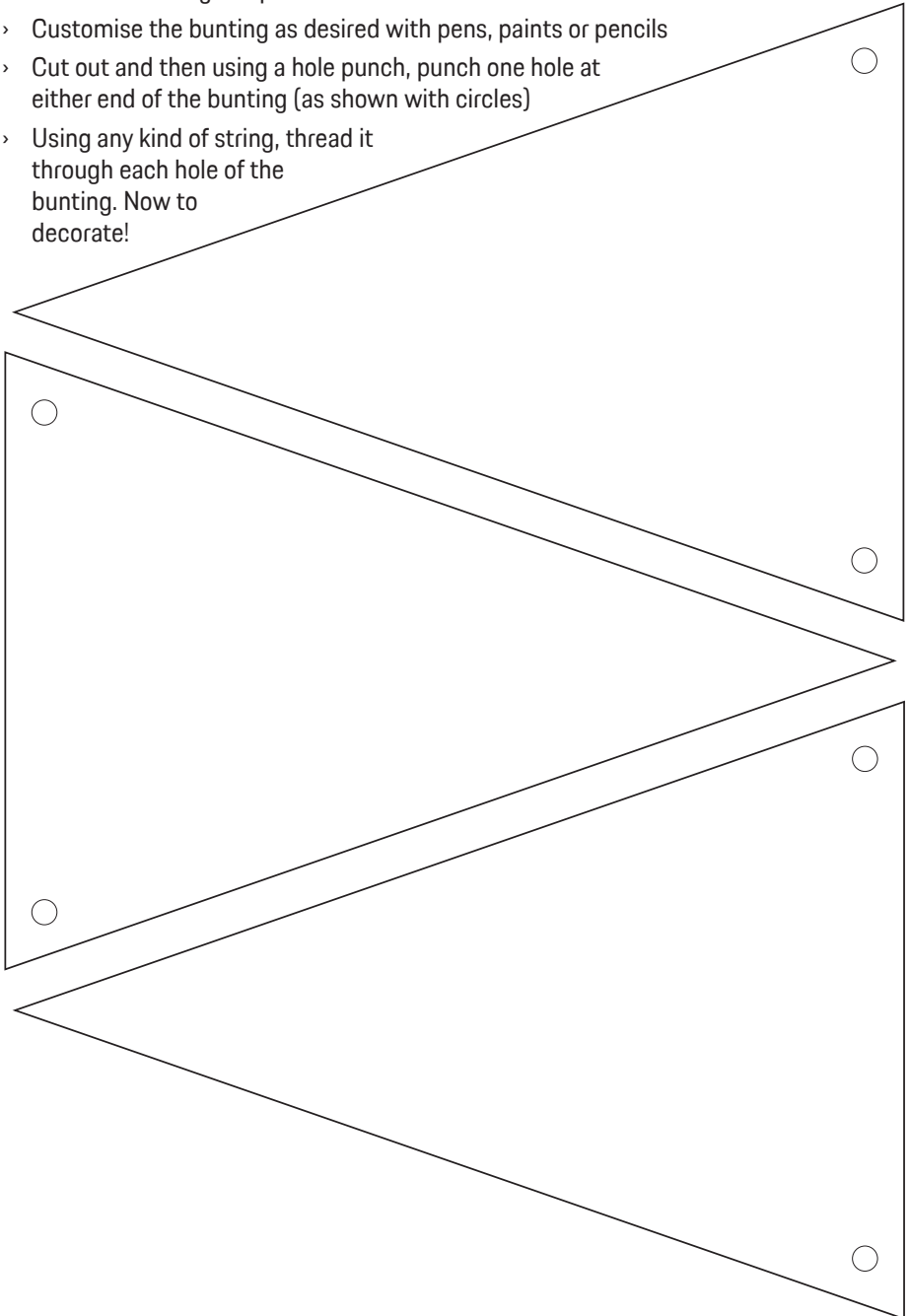


Step 4: Winner

- › The top 3 winners stand on the homemade podium and the winner receives their prize.

Bunting template

- › Print this bunting template out
- › Customise the bunting as desired with pens, paints or pencils
- › Cut out and then using a hole punch, punch one hole at either end of the bunting (as shown with circles)
- › Using any kind of string, thread it through each hole of the bunting. Now to decorate!



Flag template

- › Print this flag template out
- › Customise the flags as desired with pens, paints or pencils or keep white
- › Cut out and then wrap and stick the left side around a wooden stick - get ready to wave your flags!
